4. First aid Measures

Description of necessary first aid measures

Eye Contact: Immediately hold eyelids apart and flush the eye continuously with running water.

Ensure complete irrigation of the eye by keeping eyelids apart and away from eye and moving the eyelids by

occasionally lifting the upper and lower lids.

Continue flushing until advised to stop by the Poisons Information Centre or a doctor, or for at least 15 minutes

Inhalation: If fumes or combustion products are inhaled remove from contaminated area. Lay patient down. Keep warm

and rested. Prostheses such as false teeth, which may block airway, should be removed, where possible, prior

to initiating first aid procedures.

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Apply artificial respiration if not breathing, preferably with a demand valve resuscitator, bag valve mask device or pocket mask as trained. Perform CPR if necessary.

Give water to rinse mouth, then provide liquid slowly and as much as casualty can comfortably
